

Prayer Breakfasts


Join us for a continental breakfast followed by a time of prayer before the Sunday Service at 10am on 6th April.


Item for 'In Touch'

Improving publicity and communication for events at Emmanuel There are a number of people who undertake various tasks to ensure that events can take place at Emmanuel and are publicised. In particular our thanks to Lyn for the meticulous way that booking requests are handled. However, to publicise these meetings and events we are indebted to Megan for the bi-monthly 'In Touch' colour magazine, to Ken for the monthly 'what's on' sheet, and to Phyllis for the website and AV slides. In addition, I prepare the posters for our own events that are displayed in both foyers. Also, there can be a need for the Stewards to make an announcement at the beginning of the Service.

In order to ensure that everyone involved in these activities receives the same information an email group has been set up events@emmanuelormskirk.org.uk. By using this one email all of Lyn, Meg, Ken, Phyllis, Phil and Jane (as Senior Steward) will receive the same information at the same time. This should ensure that whatever publicity is generated, whether in print or electronic format, will be consistent. From the group's perspective we will all know that everyone has been informed of future events, including changes and updates. For example, when speakers have been booked for meetings, this information can be publicised if we are all made aware of it.

Hopefully at least some people will have noticed the new posters that I have been producing over the last couple of months, and which are now on display in both foyers.
