Dear Friends, as I write this letter, many folks will be In Telford for the Annual Methodist Conference, including Probationary Ministers and Deacons who will be welcomed into Full Connexion and Ordination. I can't believe it is 7 years since a number of you travelled by coach to share in my own ordination service- a precious day that I will never forget. The singing was awesome!

The Methodist Conference UK was established in 1774 by John Wesley, who brought together Ministers and Lay Preachers to discuss the doctrine, disciples and practices of the Church. And so, over the course of this week, representatives from each District, and from the Methodist Church Overseas will gather to review, discuss and vote upon issues from which our CPD (Constitutional Practice and Discipline) for 2025 will be published. The events of Conference can be found online and papers will be published for general circulation if anyone would like some light bedtime reading! But, of course, the workings of Conference are a very special and important process. John Wesley wanted to create a forum through which the very core values and the day-today life of the Church could be discussed by its people, both lay and ordained. The annual Conference reminds us that although we exist as a Methodist Church in Ormskirk, with our trustees, Mission Statement and Mission Plan, so too we are part of the 'Connexion' of Methodism which links us with all Methodist Churches across the world, united in worship and service.

The theme of this year's Conference is, "Our Story, Our Song," which reminds us that we are part of something far greater than ourselves. We are woven into the ongoing story of God's love in the world and invited to sing that story with our lives. I am continually blessed to play my small part in being a part of Emmanuel's Story, with you all, within the universal Church. And so, I pray that we will continue to 'sing' and praise God and share our story in our local community and in the wider world, as followers of Jesus Christ, loved by our Creator God. Community Garden

As I know many of you are aware, as part of our Mission plan we have a vision to turn the very overgrown plot of land at the back of the Langham Hall into a community garden, where vegetables can be grown and the produce given to local families in need. We envisage that this will also be a place where folks can sit and find peace amidst the busyness of the town. Discussion between myself and the staff at the Scarisbrick mental health unit have taken place regarding creating a partnership, whereby residents of the unit can assist in cultivating the garden. Finance has obviously been a major concern as the land needs to be cleared professionally, and we are currently raising funds to cover the cost of recent Tower repairs. So, we are delighted to let you all know that the garden has been professionally cleared and the wall repointed by the Civil Engineering firm A E Yates, who have been working on the railway bridge repairs. This has come about as a thank you for any inconvenience we have experienced whilst the bridge repairs have been underway. All work has been completed on the garden free of charge and A E Yates will be donating two new benches. We are immensely grateful to Chris, Josh and the team for their support with our exciting project - a real answer to prayer.

There is much still to be done to create the Community Garden but we will keep you updated, and photos will follow in due course! We are looking for grants, but I hope that maybe we will be able to cover the cost of the raised beds through local firm sponsorship. Phil has kindly recommended that we have room for 4/5 beds at a cost of approximately £500 for each raised bed and soil. And so, if you know of any firms who may be willing to 'sponsor a vegetable bed' please let us know. Dedication plaques with the names of sponsors will be affixed to the beds. Thank you, Rev Sue
